7. ADIMISSIONS

- a) **Step one**: Parents visit the school and pay registration. A code is then created for the child which enables the parent to pay using school pay.
- b) Step two: An application form is then provided followed by an admission fee.
- c) **Step three:** A parent is required to present 3 passport size photographs ,and photocopy of an immunisation card.

8. ACADEMIC GUIDELINES

a). PLAY SCHOOL

This is a section where we receive children younger than three years old instilling in them basic sensory-motor development and the social development skills.

Parents should should note that play school is not aimed at developing academic skills like reading and writing.

b). NURSERY(3 YEAR OLDS)

Our objective for the three year olds is to prepare them for kindergarten. More time is spent discussing the world around them. Basic pre-reading readiness, language development, fine motor developmentand number concepts are a large part of this years program.

All these prepare the child for the next step in his or her development.

Our main emphasis is creating an exciting and educational experience for the child through stimulating their intellectual and sensory-motor senses.

We stress the importance of being socially ready for kindergarten. Learning cannot take place unless children are comfortable with their learning environment and surroundings.

At Millies our motto is be yourself. A large part of the morning is spent in "teacher directed" time ;therefore,the children learn by example and direction.

c). KINDERGARTEN(4 YEAR OLDS)

The objectives for the four year old class is to prepare them for pre- reading readiness through jolly phonics where they put sounds together to read. This pre- reading program is suplimented with a series of visual aids and reading materials.

d). PRE- PRIMARY (5 YEAR OLDS)

A child enrolled in this class will go to first grade the following year. The reading program is still "jolly phonics" and empasizes comprehension, listening and writing skills. We use a phonetic approach to reading and testing is usually done so that progress can be assessed throughout the year.

e). HOMEWORK.

Homework is given two times a week from kindergarten(4+) to Grade three to support learning by increasing student retention and understanding of the material. Homework is a review of what is covered in class which introducespractice skills, understanding, builds confidence and give teachers feedbacks.

f). STUDENT EVALUATION:Students are assessed through mid term assessments weekly tests,monthly tests,project work, research papers and end of term assessments.

g). PHYSICAL EDUCATION/HEALTH AND AWEARNESS CLUB

All students are required to attend a gym class where they do exercise and learn health tips.

9. IT SKILLS

As part of our comprehensive curriculum, the school has computer classes for all grades and they learn from basic computer skills to advanced levels in their respective grades.

The school also is equiped with a modern computer lab where where they do programmmes like IXL MATH,ABC MOUSE which are internationally certified for children evaluation.

10. STUDENTS COUNCIL

There is a Students governing board elected by fellow students from Pre-primary through grade 3 to serve in the school whose purpose is to empower students, communication and public skills at a tender age.

11. MEETING WITH TEACHERS

Parents meet teachers on class day to discuss their childrens academic progress. Parents who miss class day should call for an appointment. Unscheduled visits to the school and classroom are not allowed.

12. STUDENTS OF THE WEEK/ MONTH

Each week a student of the week is selected from Nursery class(3 year olds) and each month a student of the month is selected from all grades by their teachers to receive awards.

The nominees photographs are displayed in the bulletin board for the whole month.

13. TUITION POLICY

Tution payments can be made at once or in two instalments. 80% should be paid at the beginning of the term and the balance to be paid after one month of the term. If a child starts a term without any payment done, he will be given only one week to be in school. Tution must be paid ontime. If you are late with your payment, a late fee notice will be sent home reflecting the amout owed.

Your child will not be allowed to stay in school if tution is more than one month overdue without an explanation.

b). **clearance card** will be given to your child on completion of the fees. It will act as a gate pass for your child to be allowed in school. It should be returned to school after three weeks.

14. SCHOOL HOURS.

The school is open from;

- a) 7:00am to 5:00pm for full day
- b) 7:00am to 12:30pm for half day.
- c) Lessons begin at7:30am for pre-primary to graders
- d) 8:30am for Nursery section.

15. LATE PICK UP

We ask your cooperation in picking up your child promptly at dismissal. In the event of an emergency please call the office. Late charges begin at 6:00pm at fee of 20,000=

16. MEDICAL

a). HEALTH POLICY

We need your help in protecting all the children from contageous illnesses. If you suspect that your child is ill please keep your child home. No child will be allowed in school with a fever. If your child becomes ill at school please prepare to pick up your child in less than an hour after you are notified.

b). MEDICAL ADMINISTRATION

We will gladly administer medication to your child while at school if you give us permission by dropping the medicine at school and signing an authorization form.

- > Be confident and explain to your child what to expect.

24. CRUCIAL TASK(S) FOR THE CHILD TO LEARN

- To expand their dependency from a parent and secure a home environment to include peers, other adults and school environment.
- Manage seperation anxiety ;some acomplish this with a minimum distress. For others the stress of a mom or dad isfrightening and extremely stressful for both the child and mom/dad.
- Accept the friendship of adults other than family members. This is a new experience to them. Realise that word "stranger" can be good or bad. Remember their new teachers are strangers. They must know they are "good strangers".
